**Celebrant** and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving  
to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation,  
this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon  
these gifts, that they may be the sacrament  
of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant.  
Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made  
acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ,  
and make them new, and bring us to that city of light  
where you dwell with all your sons and daughters;  
through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation,  
the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the  
Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father,  
now and for ever. **Amen.**

**in our community. May you, enthroned on the altar, be now**  
**enthroned in my heart; may you, present in bread and wine,**  
**feed and renew my soul; may you, who give yourself to us**  
**again, fill us with grace and heavenly blessing. Even as I am**  
**fed, may my hunger for you and your reign of justice and**  
**peace increase, that I may, with your Spirit, work for that day**  
**when your reign shall come on earth as it is in heaven. Amen.**
